

The Clinton Township Board of Trustees and the Franklin County Engineer are holding a public hearing on the proposed Chambers Road Sidewalk project and proposed use of CDBG funds for this proposed project. This public hearing will be held during the Clinton Township Board of Trustees meeting at 6:00 p.m. local time on June 11, 2024, at the Clinton Township Fire Department located at 999 Chambers Road, Columbus, Ohio 43212. Franklin County Engineer's Office staff will be in attendance to review the project and collect questions and comments from the public.

Project Description: This project will construct 900 feet of 6-foot wide sidewalk on Chambers Road, between Kenny Road and Hess Boulevard, along with 1090 feet of combination curb & gutter, drainage, and associated work.
