

APPENDIX A

1.1 PROJECT ACTIVITIES:

The project includes the installation of approximately 620 feet of storm sewer pipe, demolition of existing storm sewer structures within Genessee Avenue and within right-of-way of an alley to connect to the existing Earl Avenue storm sewer system. The project will be competitively bid by the Franklin County Engineer's Office and constructed by a contractor. The project will provide long-term, permanent impact in the community by addressing public and private property drainage concerns in the area.

1.2 DOCUMENT THE NEED FOR THE PROJECT (in five, one-sentence bulletpoints):

- Repair a collapsed drainage system.
- Stop premature deterioration of the road due to the road base standing saturated.
- End standing water around residential properties.
- End property owners filling catch basins with dirt and gravel, to stop water from coming to their properties.
- Better drain water away from sanitary sewer lines to reduce the amount of storm water infiltrating into the sanitary sewer lines.
