


How did we get here?




The engagement process resulted in the draft plan. We wanted to check in before moving on to the final public meeting!

Plan Visions

Land Use	Support the small-town, country feel.
Quality of Development	Complement existing land uses and support economic development.
Sense of Community	Visual appeal informed by the Village's history and brings residents together.
Housing	Variety of housing that promotes aging in place.
Parks and Recreation	Sufficient parks and green space for all ages and abilities.
Walking	Safe and well-maintained pedestrian network.
Transit	Bus network with frequent, comfortable service with sufficient destinations.
Roadways	Balance well-connected street networks with drivers abiding by speed limits.

Policy Recommendations

- Main themes:
 - Strategic growth
 - Community building
 - Safe travel
- Goals are the outcomes needed to fulfill the vision
 - Actions are a set of initiatives that complete the goals
- Some suggestions made it into the plan while others did not based on feedback
